Current role:

Professor Mehta retired from the NHS in January 2019 at the age of 65 years. He continues in private practice in central London, principally in general haematology and coagulation. He also does medico-legal work, consultancy (principally in gene therapy), research and charitable work.

Interests and Expertise:

Haematology: General Clinical and Laboratory Haematology, Transfusion Medicine, metabolic medicine and coagulation. His clinical interests span both malignant and non-malignant haematology and include the treatment of acute and chronic leukaemias, myeloma, lymphoma and non malignant conditions. He continues in private practice in general haematology and coagulation. He has published more than 350 peer reviewed articles in research journals, 40 chapters and 5 books. He has co-authored standard undergraduate and post-graduate textbooks in (3 in Haematology, and 2 in Lysosomal Storage Diseases). He is an internationally acknowledged expert in adult Lysosomal Storage diseases, Chairing and lecturing at International and National congresses, giving 15-20 presentations per year up to the year 2020. He has presented evidence before the US FDA, UK MHRA/NICE, and the European EMA.

Medico-Legal: He has been doing medico-legal work for over 20 years, providing reports for Claimants and Defendants (Split is 70:30) in addition to commissioned work and court appearances. He works closely with an associate (a consultant haematologist at Imperial) who is in active NHS clinical practice.

He undertakes reports where he has appropriate experience – general haematology, including coagulation and hospital transfusion; malignant and non-malignant haematology. He makes 1-2 court appearances yearly and produces more than 200 reports annually including 3-5 joint reports. He has attended accredited courses eg the Inspire MedLaw course in Oxford, March 2020. He completed the InspireMedLaw report writing course in June 2021 and the BMA Courtroom skills course and IDF medico=legal courses in 2023.
